Are We a Vibrant Community? FR. BOSCO PADAMATTUMMAL

the year 1263 a priest from Prague was on route to Rome, making a pilgrimage to ask God for help in strengthening his faith since he was having doubts about his vocation. Along the way he stopped in Bolsena 70 miles north of Rome. While celebrating Mass there, as he raised the host during the consecration, the bread turned into flesh and began to bleed. The drops of blood fell onto the small white cloth on the altar, called the corporal. The following year, 1264, Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus - today's feast, Corpus Christi. The Pope asked St. Thomas Aquinas, living at that time, to write hymns for the feast and he wrote two, better known to the older members of our congregation, Tantum Ergo and O Salutaris. That blood-stained corporal may still be seen in the Basilica of Orvieto north of Rome.

The Eucharist is often spoken of as the very center of Christian living. There is a very real danger for Christian communities of collapsing or degenerating when deprived of the Eucharist for any length of time. No one can, in effect, remain a committed Catholic Christian without participation in the Eucharist. Every

persecuted Church realizes this and struggles to keep the Eucharist alive in its communities. We have seen that in countless examples over the centuries.

Basically two things happen when we celebrate the Eucharist:

- a. We remember and we give thanks. The word 'Eucharist' is derived from a Greek word for 'thanks'. Above all, we remember with deep gratitude all that God has done for us in Jesus Christ; through His life, suffering, death and resurrection. We also remember and give thanks for all our own personal experiences of God's love at work in our lives. And we remember and give thanks not only for what happened a long time ago but most especially for what is happening in our lives at this time.
- b. We come together to celebrate our being a community and a fellowship in Christ. Although the Eucharist is at the center of our Christian life, it cannot survive in a vacuum. That is why I like to say that the Eucharist is, by and large, the measure of a Christian

community. From the way a congregation celebrates its Eucharist one can know immediately whether this is a living or a dying or dead community. A dead or non-existent community cannot have a living Eucharist. Today is the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Body we celebrate today is the Body of the Risen Jesus. All of us who are baptized are members, constituent parts of that Body. When we approach the altar to receive Communion, the priest or minister says, "The Body of Christ". When we say our "Amen" of assent in faith, we need to be aware that the Body we are receiving is that Risen Body of Jesus, of which each one present is a part.

Dear brothers and sisters, a parish where Mass-going is basically the only activity of its members is going to be a dead parish and its Eucharistic celebration will also be disappearing soon. A vibrant Christian community centered on Eucharist will have different activities in their community. We have bible studies throughout the year, we plan to start the Alpha course for the whole parish community to know more about our faith, and in the coming Lent we will have the Fish Fry to bring lots of people together at St. Mary's. Our Ice Cream Social is also one of our social activities to bring people together. So let us not give up any good activities that we have in our parish community but let us add something new to make it a strong vibrant community.
